Since 2018, Olga Vladimirovna Arkhangelskaya has been engaged in organizing research activities at the Institute of Traditional Applied Arts – Moscow branch of the Higher School of Folk Arts, working as the head of the research department and as a researcher. Olga Vladimirovna's responsibilities were multifaceted: she led the Student Scientific Society, organized student competitions and scientific events, authored scholarly articles, and contributed to collective monographs. Additionally, she taught economics and management. Her exceptional professional and personal qualities enabled her to engage students, broadening their horizons in economic knowledge both in daily life and future professional business activities. Both Academy members and students from the institutes of the Higher School of Folk Arts gratefully recall not only her classes on economics but also the numerous scientific events she organized. These include the annual Science Day held at the institute, scientific seminars and roundtable discussions on artistic embroidery, and the memorable multi-day event – the Exhibition Forum “Heritage of Traditional Artistic Embroidery of Russia” in 2023, where Olga Vladimirovna was an active member of the organizational team. Another notable event was the Day of Folk Art Crafts in 2024.

To her colleagues, Olga Vladimirovna was a shining example of optimism, diligence, integrity, and compassion. She always maintained an active stance, characterized by genuine intellectualism, professionalism, and zest for life. Calm, kind, tactful, responsive, and attentive—she earned respect and affection from both her fellow educators and students alike.
